The Island's oldest law firm was founded 150 years ago by Edward Voisin and has been at the heart of legal matters ever since.

It became a family affair in 1897 when Edward's son Albert joined the practice, then operating in the Royal Square. The next generation saw Albert's nephew Ralph Voisin become part of the team in 1925.

By the early sixties, the firm had merged to become Voisin, Renouf, Ereaut, Gibaut. Sir Frank Ereaut was elected Bailiff of Jersey and a couple of years later, Ralph Voisin was appointed Magistrate of Jersey's Police Court, known today as the Magistrate's Court.

In the seventies, the team moved offices to Templar House and with a new name, Michael Voisin & Co began promoting Jersey as an International Finance Centre. By the eighties they had started providing trust and corporate services.

The firm moved to brand new purpose built premises at 37 Esplanade in 2013, these offices are still home to Voisin today, in the year that we celebrate our 150th anniversary.

Exclusive events with a local feel including a client party, a visit from a leading sports lawyer and a new charity of choice are just some of the big plans that we have to celebrate this milestone.
